High School Videos Showcase Creativity, Humor

2014 Water Spots Winners Announced

SACRAMENTO-- Bridget Eason from St. Francis High School in Sacramento took top honors in the 2014 Water Spots Video Contest, sponsored by the Regional Water Authority, local water providers and The Sacramento Bee.



Eason won the "Judge's Choice" first place award and the "People's Choice" award for receiving the most votes online. Other top prizes went to Joshua Moessner from Center High School in Antelope who took the "Judge's Choice" second place award and the team of Michael Abshear and Noah Spahn from Whitney High School in Rocklin who won the "Judge's Choice" third place award. Their videos were among nearly 80 submitted by high school students from Sacramento, Placer and El Dorado counties. From tips for avoiding a "sprinkler disaster" to a recipe for making water using "regular household ingredients" (hint: don't forget the flaked coconut), students demonstrated their creativity in 30-second public service announcement videos on the contest's 2014 theme: *Don't be a gutter flooder--prevent overspray and runoff.*

Celebrity judges narrowed videos down to 10 finalists and then selected the top three winners for "Judge's Choice" awards. The public then voted for their favorite to receive the "People's Choice" award.

The finalist videos and winners were unveiled April 13 on Raley Field's Jumbotron before a Sacramento River Cats game. Winning students and teachers also received cash prizes. Other Water Spots finalists included:
