

To comply with the Governor's Executive Order, the City of Roseville has increased water use restrictions for Roseville water customers.

# WHAT DOES THAT MEAN FOR ME?

- Overall water use must be reduced by 28% compared to 2013

## Watering days are in effect:

Customer Type	Time of Year	Watering Days	No Irrigation During
Residential	May - August	Monday & Friday	10 a.m. - 8 p.m.
Non-Residential	May - August	Monday & Thursday	
All	September - April	Monday	
All	Drip irrigation is exempt from watering day restrictions		

- Low volume drip irrigation is exempt from watering day restrictions
- Unless recycled water is used, golf courses must reduce irrigation by 28% compared to 2013
- Irrigation periods refer to the period beginning at 12 a.m. on that day and ending 24 hours later
- Water must be confined to the user's property and shall not runoff
- All leaks must be repaired within five days unless specified sooner
- Decorative fountains, decorative pools and waterways must be drained (except ponds containing fish)
- Washing hardscapes like streets, parking lots, driveways, sidewalks, or buildings is prohibited unless required for health and safety purposes
- Automatic shut-off nozzles are required on all hoses
- Wash boats/cars using an automatic shut-off nozzle or at commercial car wash that recirculates water
- Covers are required for all new pools and spas
- New or expanded landscaping is limited to drought-tolerant trees, shrubs and ground-cover and is irrigated using a low volume drip irrigation system. No new turf shall be installed
- All landscaping installations must comply with the City's Water Efficient Landscape Ordinance
- Water only served upon request at restaurants
- Water must be used for beneficial purposes only; unnecessary and wasteful uses are prohibited
- Use of potable water for dust control is prohibited, unless recycled water is used
