Get ready for MULCH MAYHEM!

Free Mulch Available Saturday, September 25

SACRAMENTO— Free water-saving mulch will be available during Mulch Mayhem events throughout the Sacramento region on **Saturday**, **September 25**, **2021 from 8 a.m. to noon**.

These FREE events are designed to help local residents get their yards ready for fall planting. Mulch slows evaporation, moderates soil temperature, beautifies landscapes and even controls weeds. As it breaks down, mulch also adds helpful nutrients to the soil.

Water efficiency managers estimate that residents can save 30 gallons of water for every 1,000 square feet just by adding two to three inches of organic mulch (e.g., leaves and wood chips) around plants and four to six inches around trees (taking care to keep mulch away from the base of trees).
